



WHAT A SCOOP! Less than two years after taking her first tentative step into retail, Fleet entrepreneur Kate Cottrell is moving her zerowaste shop Scoop into a central location in the town

• ENVIRONMENT

coop is a great example of a successful high street business flourishing - just two years after it first opened Kate Cottrell has moved to a new premises in the centre of town at 184 Fleet Road.

Customers can bring their own containers (or purchase in store) and buy items such as herbs, spices, dried fruit, nuts, flour, oils, shampoo and conditioner, shower gels, washing up liquid and cleaning products. Products are sourced from ethical suppliers and local producers are chosen wherever possible. Scoop also stocks re-useable face cloths, bamboo toothbrushes, reusable straws and traditional wooden toys. More recently Scoop's range has been expanded to include the very Popular Tony's Chocolonely and vegan sweets

doesn't have and plans include refill wine and local beer. to cost the Kate founded Scoop in 2019 to allow customers to shop without plastic, bringing their own containers, buying items by weight or volume


